Blessing of a Christmas Manger

In its present form the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas crèche or manger for Christmas Eve of 1223.

The blessing of the Christmas manger or nativity scene may take place on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time.

When the manger is set up in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another family member.

All make the sign of the cross as
the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.

R/. Who made heaven and earth.

One of those present or the leader reads
a text of sacred Scripture, for example,
Luke 2:1 (lines 1-8) or Isaiah 7:10
(lines 10-15, the birth of Emmanuel).

Reader: The Gospel of the Lord.

R/. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The leader prays with hands joined:

God of every nation and people,
from the very beginning of creation
you have made manifest your love:

when our need for a Savior was great

you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin
Mary.

To our lives he brings joy and peace,
justice, mercy, and love.

Lord,

bless all who look upon this manger;
may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus,
and raise our thoughts to him,
who is God-with-us and Savior of all,
and who lives and reigns forever and ever.

of Silos*

Feast Day – December 20

1000-1073

As a youth Dominic tended sheep on the foothills of the Pyrenees where he learned to appreciate solitude. He then pursued the quiet life as a monk. Dominic became the prior of his monastery, but was forced to flee by the king of Navarre, who intended to seize the monastery's land. The monastery of St. Sebastian at Silos welcomed him. There as prior, Dominic conducted a successful program of spiritual and material renewal. The Dominicans especially honor him. For a century after Dominic's death, Blessed Joan of Aza visited his tomb. There she had a vision promising her that she would have another son. When the child was born she named him Dominic and he became the founder of the Dominican Order.

Fiesta - 20 de diciembre

1000-1073

De joven Domingo cuidaba ovejas en las estribaciones de los Pirineos, donde aprendió a apreciar la soledad. Luego siguió la vida tranquila como monje. Domingo se convirtió en prior de su monasterio, pero se vio obligado a huir por el rey de Navarra, que pretendía apoderarse de las tierras del monasterio. Le acogió el monasterio de San Sebastián de Silos. Allí, como antes, Domingo llevó a cabo un exitoso programa de renovación espiritual y material. Los dominicanos lo honran especialmente. Durante un siglo después de la muerte de Domingo, la Beata Juana de Aza visitó su tumba. Allí tuvo una visión prometiéndole que tendría otro hijo. Cuando nació el niño, ella lo nombró Domingo y se convirtió en el fundador de la Orden Dominicana.

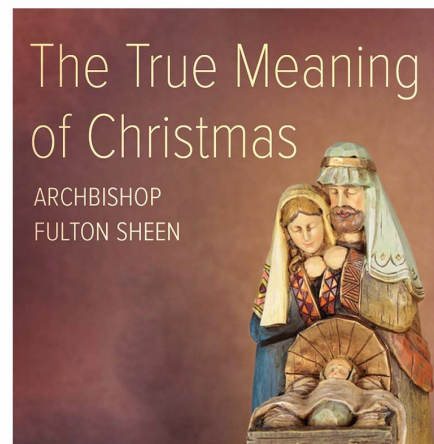

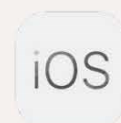
