



THE GLORY OF THE DIVINE WAY

Today's readings draw us into ageless, vibrant depths. Followers of God's law, we belong to ancient traditions. Children of God, we marvel at the freshness of creation. The Old Testament readings, from Sirach and the Psalms, celebrate the rich blessings we receive when we observe God's commands-not because we are slaves to the law, but because the law gives life in abundance. Saint Paul's Letter to the Corinthians confirms the glory of divine law, but warns that God's ways tend to be unpopular and misunderstood in this world. Paul speaks of the ancient wisdom of God, which is mysteriously both "hidden" and "revealed." God does not have secret codes that we earthly mortals cannot understand; in love, God reveals the glory of the divine way in Jesus. Saint Matthew's Gospel emphasizes the importance of living in God's law, enlivened by a deep and personal relationship with Jesus. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order

On February 17 we honor the seven founding saints of the Order of the Servants of the Virgin Mary. Bonfilius, Alexis, Manettus, Amideus, Hugh, Sostene and Buonagiunta were a group of merchants of Florence who, upon experiencing an apparition of the Blessed Virgin in 1233, renounced their businesses, left what was necessary for their families, and distributed the rest among the poor. They then dedicated themselves entirely to the veneration of the Virgin Mary, going to live on an Italian mountain, each assuming the life of a hermitprayer, extreme fasting and penance. Sometime later, at the request of the pope's delegate, all but one were ordained priests. Brother Alexis, considering himself unworthy of the priesthood, decided to remain as a brother. They were all canonized in 1888. Their feast day, originally February 11, now falls on the 17th, the date of the death of the last of the seven founders. Brother Alexis died at the age of 110. FEBRUARY 12, 2023 SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

BEING FAITHFUL DISCIPLES

Our readings today together provide powerful insight into how to be faithful disciples. Sirach reminds us that, in the deepest places in ourselves, in our primary attitudes and tendencies in living, we face choices. We have real agency to embrace what is good, and resist what is destructive, for our own flourishing and for the common good. We are shaped, but we are not ultimately shackled, by social forces or by other persons. In Matthew's Gospel, we read that God cares not only about our observing boundaries, but about these deep areas of ourselves and our basic choices in life. God knows our fears and wounds that influence our choices. God is actively providing wisdom, as Paul wrote to the Corinthians. God will help us sort out the bewildering decisions we often face. God is here, deep within, offering challenge, healing, and courage so we may choose to love.

BOTH PRESENT AND FUTURE

Matthew continues Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in today's Gospel, which is Jesus' extended teaching on the central theme of his ministry, the Kingdom of Heaven. Matthew highlights Jesus as a teacher like Moses, and who is rooted in the law of Moses. Jesus interprets the law by intensifying its meaning, by going to the root values behind the specific teachings in the law. These include reconciliation with others; mutual care for all persons as sacred, especially women; and being trustworthy and honest.

The Kingdom of Heaven is described as both in the present and in the future. When these values are lived out in daily life within the community, the Kingdom becomes present there and demonstrable to others. Jesus also spoke about life in the future, when God fulfills the divine promises to establish fully justice and peace on earth. The reconciliation, care, and trust experienced now will reach their fullness in the promised Kingdom.

WITH EACH OTHER

Jesus' Sermon on the Mount today turns to the relationships within the community. Jesus understands the traditional teachings about relationships in light of the coming Kingdom. He describes a deep trust and accountability among members of the community. Not settling for meeting minimum requirements, he points his new community toward an intimate knowledge and caring for each other, so that all may flourish as individuals and as a whole.

Although he highlights the dignity of each individual person, Jesus also envisions a community life where there is both a responsibility for each other and an accountability to

each other. Members are to attend to each other's struggles and sorrows. Members become aware that their individual choices and lifestyle will be an example to others. We are to work out how to follow Jesus together in community, not only as individuals. We discern and live out our community's vocation, not only our own. Our unity with God is also with each other.

Nuestras lecturas de hoy nos ofrecen una poderosa visión de cómo ser discípulos fieles. El libro del Eclesiástico nos recuerda que, en lo más profundo de nosotros mismos, en nuestras principales actitudes y tendencias de vida, tenemos que elegir. Tenemos la capacidad real de abrazar lo que es bueno y resistirnos a lo que es destructivo, para nuestro propio florecimiento y para el bien común. Estamos condicionados, pero no encadenados en última instancia, por las fuerzas sociales o por otras personas. En el Evangelio de Mateo, leemos que Dios se preocupa no sólo de que observemos nuestros límites, sino de esas zonas profundas de nosotros mismos y de nuestras opciones básicas en la vida. Dios conoce nuestros miedos y las heridas que influyen en nuestras elecciones. Dios proporciona activamente sabiduría, como escribió Pablo a los corintios. Dios nos ayudará a ordenar las desconcertantes decisiones a las que a menudo nos enfrentamos. Dios está aquí, en lo más profundo de nuestro ser, ofreciéndonos desafíos, sanación y coraje para que podamos elegir amar.

PRESENTE Y FUTURO

Mateo continúa en el Evangelio de hoy el Sermón de la Montaña, que es la extensa enseñanza de Jesús sobre el tema central de su ministerio, el Reino de los Cielos. Mateo destaca a Jesús como un maestro como Moisés, y que hunde sus raíces en la ley de Moisés. Jesús interpreta la ley intensificando su significado, yendo a los valores fundamentales que subyacen a las enseñanzas específicas de la ley. Éstos incluyen la reconciliación con los demás; el cuidado mutuo de todas las personas como algo sagrado, especialmente las mujeres; y ser digno de confianza y honesto.

El Reino de los Cielos se describe tanto en el presente como en el futuro. Cuando estos valores se viven en la vida cotidiana dentro de la comunidad, el Reino se hace presente allí y demostrable a los demás. Jesús también habló de la vida en el futuro, cuando Dios cumpla las promesas divinas de establecer plenamente la justicia y la paz en la tierra. La reconciliación, el cuidado y la confianza que se viven ahora alcanzarán su plenitud en el Reino prometido.

LOS UNOS CON LOS OTROS

El Sermón de la Montaña de hoy gira en torno a las relaciones dentro de la comunidad. Jesús entiende las enseñanzas tradicionales sobre las relaciones a la luz del Reino venidero. Describe una profunda confianza y responsabilidad entre los miembros de la comunidad. No se conforma con cumplir unos requisitos mínimos, sino que orienta a su nueva comunidad hacia el conocimiento íntimo y el cuidado mutuo, para que todos puedan prosperar como individuos y como conjunto.

Aunque subraya la dignidad de cada persona, Jesús también imagina una vida comunitaria en

la que existe una responsabilidad mutua. Los miembros deben atender a las luchas y penas de los demás. Los miembros son conscientes de que sus opciones individuales y su estilo de vida serán un ejemplo para los demás. Debemos encontrar la manera de seguir a Jesús juntos en comunidad, no sólo como individuos. Discernimos y vivimos la vocación de nuestra comunidad, no sólo la nuestra. Nuestra unidad con Dios es también entre nosotros.


RESTORE THE CHURCH BUILD THE FUTURE

In late February 2022, after years of simmering tensions and a monthslong buildup of troops on the Russia-Ukraine border, Russian forces invaded Ukraine in a nationwide assault involving ground forces, armored vehicles, warships, and airstrikes. The need for humanitarian aid and pastoral support for the Ukrainian people was great and immediate, especially the millions of internally displaced persons fleeing war-torn areas for other locations within the country. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Subcommittee on Aid to the Church in Central and Eastern Europe was poised to provide immediate aid to Ukraine thanks to well-established, decades-long relationships with bishops and Catholic organizations in the region.

Through the generosity of parishioners to the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, nearly 50 emergency aid grants, totaling more than half a million dollars, brought humanitarian aid to victims and refugees in Ukraine, Poland, Slovakia, and Moldova between February and May 2022. For example, the Kyiv archeparchy of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church (UGCC) provided emergency shelter in its cathedral basements to Kyiv residents fleeing bombardment. The UGCC's patriarchal curia was provided with a satellite communications package that allowed key personnel to maintain contact and coordinate priestly ministry and emergency relief to people nationwide. Caritas Ukraine acquired the food, tents, blankets, and personal hygiene products so desperately needed by people who sought aid at relief centers throughout the country with collection funds.

Your support for the collection is crucial to helping the Church fulfill its mission to minister to people's spiritual and material needs in Ukraine and more than 25 other countries throughout Central and Eastern Europe, especially in times of serious hardship.


