Pentecost Sunday

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Before there was water, there was fire. Once in a while, a volcano hints at the sizzling magma upon which the whole human enterprise floats. Over eons, the surface cooled off a bit, and rain sizzled down for thousands of centuries, filling the oceans and sculpting the earth. We Christians can catch God’s glory in a shimmering pool of water, but we can also capture God’s burning desire to fan the tiny flames of our baptismal candles into something that will make a difference.

In Sicily to this day, there is a custom of scattering rose petals down from the ceiling of church on the heads of the faithful, an effective reminder of the “tongues of flame” descending on the apostles, and a sign that the Holy Spirit still is poured out on the baptized. It is not merely a quaint custom, but a fairly potent sign of what baptism does. An interesting sidebar: if you have traced the Epiphany blessing on your doorway in chalk, Pentecost is the day to erase it. From now on, no need to rely on the “wise men”—you are alive in the Spirit!

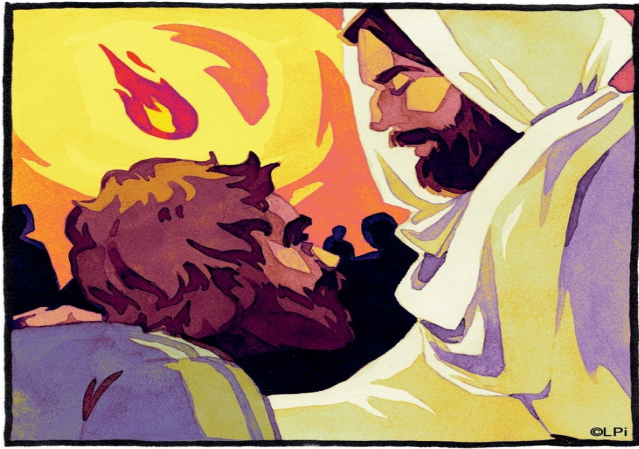

Pentecost

Today the Church remembers the moment when the very breath of God rushed from the mouth of the risen Jesus, filling the disciples with the Holy Spirit. Today's readings bring us to the culmination of the great fifty-day celebration of Easter with images of strong driving winds and tongues of fire. We cry out to God in today's psalm, "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth!" During these fifty days, we have baptized, confirmed, and shared the Eucharist with the newly initiated. We have spent these days savoring the meaning of the sacramental life. In these sacramental moments, the Church is reborn. In this moment of Pentecost, we are reborn. We are given the gifts of the Holy Spirit so that we, like the disciples, can be sent forth to be Christ for the world. Let us be open and vulnerable to the driving winds and tongues of flame that can signal a new Pentecost. Let God's word once again bring us the power to renew the face of the earth.

GOT SPIRIT?

When we were in high school, there was an old cheer at ballgames, "We've got spirit, yes we do. We've got spirit, how 'bout you?" We would scream it back and forth with the opposing team's fans. And while, "Got Spirit?" could certainly be the catchphrase today, we see people receiving the spirit in many different ways. In Acts, there appear a loud noise and a driving wind, followed by people being able to understand speech in many languages. It is reminiscent of a booming, "This is my Son, my Beloved." Psalm 104 "Lord, Send out Your Spirit" was also the first psalm used at the Easter Vigil, in response to the creation story. First Corinthians acknowledges that there are many different spiritual gifts, but we must use them together as the body of Christ. The Sequence is a beautiful prayer that calls down the Spirit. In John's Gospel, the Spirit comes through the breath of Jesus. What can we take away from this? That the Spirit of God is not "one size fits all." Rather, the Holy Spirit will come to us, speak to us, be given to us, as each of us needs.

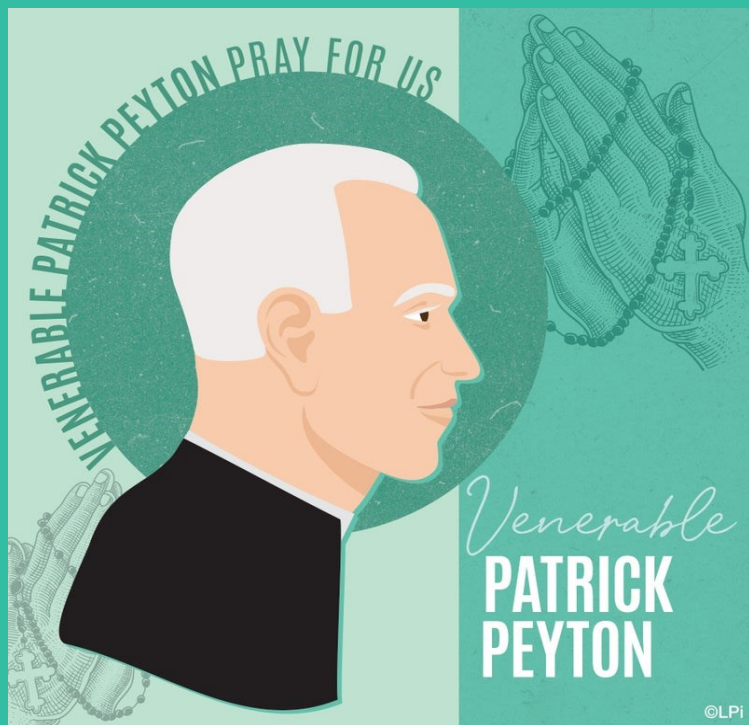
To the Holy Spirit

Originally hoping to embody the American dream and find a job to bring him and his family wealth, Patrick eventually landed as the sexton, or as he referred to the job — “a janitor” — in St. Peter’s Cathedral under the guidance of Monsignor Paul Kelly. This job, which had Patrick in the Cathedral and among other religious daily, reignited Patrick’s interest in a vocation. As he was lacking his high school education, Monsignor Kelly instructed him to pursue his education first and then investigate joining a novitiate. Soon after this directive, both Patrick and his brother entered the Congregation of Holy Cross in Notre Dame where they finished their high school education and went on to study at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

During his second year at the university, Patrick was diagnosed with tuberculosis and had to leave school to be transferred back to Notre

Dame for more intense long-term care. During his time in their infirmary, he dedicated himself to constant prayer, seeking the help and intercession of Mary, Mother of God. It was this devotion to Mary that he credits for the miraculous healing of the disease. His lungs eventually cleared and healed completely so he returned to the university to finish his studies and take his vows as soon as he could. He was ordained on June 15, 1941, at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart at the University of Notre Dame, along with his brother Thomas, as priests of the Congregation of Holy Cross.

For his first priestly assignment he was sent to Albany, New York, as a chaplain of the Holy Cross Brothers of the Vincentian Institute. While there, Peyton began the Crusade for Family Prayer. He wrote letters to bishops, Catholic laity leaders, and other Catholic groups promoting the importance of praying the rosary together. Due to his life-long dedication to the Holy Mother and the rosary, he became known as “The Rosary Priest.” He coined the now popular phrases — “The family that prays together stays together” as well as “A world at prayer is a world at peace.”

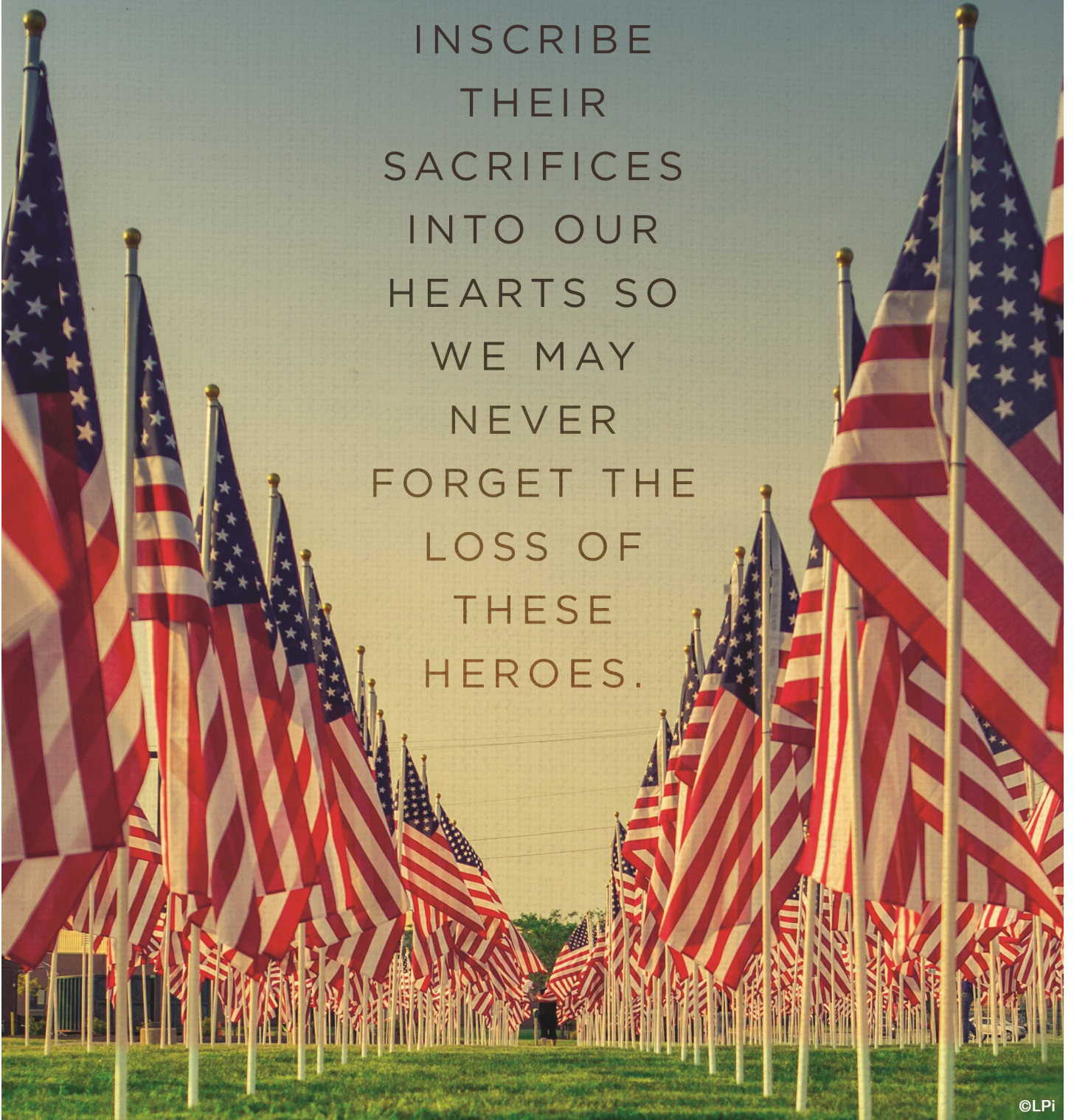
Father Patrick’s hope was to inspire 10 million Americans to pray the rosary together in their homes — a goal he would eventually meet and exceed many times over. As his efforts were being made during a time when the world was at war and anxiety was high among American families, he continually preached that prayer would lead to peace and safety saying, “The rosary is the offensive weapon that will destroy Communism — the great evil that seeks to destroy the faith.”

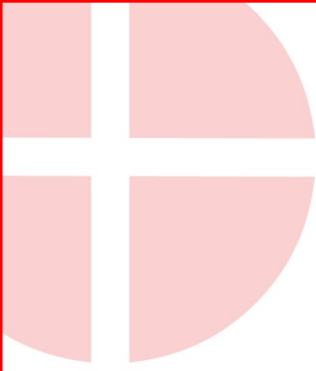
His efforts with the Rosary Crusades were duplicated around the world and promoted in countries from Brussels to Brazil! As post World War II peace felt continually threatened by the Cold War, the Holy See recognized Patrick’s efforts and spread his message even further across the world. In 1947, Father Patrick founded Family Theater Productions, which still exists today, and made himself a major pioneer of mass-media evangelism often rubbing elbows with celebrities, artists, and famous leaders. This mastery of media caused his Rosary Crusade to attract millions of people as he traveled around the world with his message of peaceful prayer. In fact, anyone on the planet who has access to the internet can still participate in a daily recording of the rosary that is livestreamed by an organization called Family Rosary. Founded by Fr. Patrick, Family Rosary livestreams a Mass and rosary on the Family Rosary Facebook page every single day to over 1,325,000 followers!

Father Patrick Peyton died peacefully in 1992 at age 83 while holding a rosary in his hands. Pope Francis declared that Father Patrick Peyton lived a life of heroic virtue on December 18, 2017, and gave him the title of venerable.

Pentecost

Pentecost marks the occasion of God sending the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples after his Resurrection. The book of Acts describes how the disciples were gathered together in one place on the day of Pentecost. The Jewish feast of Pentecost (Shavuot or the Feast of Weeks) was a day that commemorated the giving of the law to Moses, a day soon to be marked as well by the giving of the Holy Spirit.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit gave the disciples the strength to fulfill their commission to spread the Good News of Jesus. The Solemnity of Pentecost, which crowns and fulfills the Easter season, is a good time to pray for a deeper indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

The following prayer was recited by Pope Benedict XVI in a homily on November 7, 2006. This is a prayer to the Holy Spirit.

Let us invoke him
so that he will irrigate, warm and straighten,
so that he will pervade us
with the power of his sacred flame
and renew the earth.
Let us pray for his with all our hearts
at this time, in these days.
Amen.
