

EUCARISTIC HIGHLIGHT OF THE WEEK



Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink? Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. God's whole plan for our salvation is directed to our participation in the life of the Trinity, the communion of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our sharing in this life begins with our Baptism, when by the power of the Holy Spirit we are joined to Christ, thus becoming adopted sons and daughters of the Father. It is strengthened and increased in Confirmation. It is nourished and deepened through our participation in the Eucharist. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life. "Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me" (Jn 6:57). By being united to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us, we are drawn up into the eternal relationship of love among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As Jesus is the eternal Son of God by nature, so we become sons and daughters of God by adoption through the sacrament of

Baptism. Through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation (Chrismation), we are temples of the Holy Spirit, who dwells in us, and by his indwelling we are made holy by the gift of sanctifying grace. The ultimate promise of the Gospel is that we will share in the life of the Holy Trinity. The Fathers of the Church called this participation in the divine life "divinization" (theosis). In this we see that God does not merely send us good things from on high; instead, we are brought up into the inner life of God, the communion among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In the celebration of the Eucharist (which means "thanksgiving") we give praise and glory to God for this sublime gift.



CHANGES TO BE MADE

Last Sunday's "Parable of the rich fool" delivered a compelling reason to do the right thing—now: "You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you." Today, Jesus warns us: "You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Though we do not know when our Master will come, we do know what our Master expects to find. Jesus expects us to be vigilant and diligent in our work for the kingdom, but also filled with reverent mercy toward our fellow servants and ourselves. What changes do I need to make, right now, so that the many people outside "the Master's house" will want to come inside to experience the healing comfort of Jesus' own mercy in the compassion of Jesus' modern-day disciples?

VIGILANCE


Today Jesus proposes an attitude universally countercultural: vigilance. Whatever our other differences, we moderns dread delay; we hate to wait! All three readings call us to faith-filled vigilance, "focused" waiting, holy patience. In communion with our ancestors across the centuries—those to whom Wisdom and Hebrews were addressed—we, recalling the Rich Fool's sudden demise, must work, witness, and worship in this world with our hearts set on the future that God has prepared for us, the fulfillment of bold and beautiful promises: deliverance from threats without and burdens within, a heavenly homeland, a city yet to come. Well might all of us called to spiritual vigilance also spare a thought for those who work while others sleep—police, firefighters, first responders—making our own the night prayer attributed to Saint Augustine: "Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who wake, or watch, or weep tonight, and give your angels and saints charge over those who sleep. Tend your sick ones, O Lord Christ, give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. Amen."

DILIGENCE

Our watchfulness is to be not only prayerful but service-oriented, that active-contemplative balance so often proposed by Luke's Jesus. Though ignorance of the master's wishes may win some a reprieve, Jesus presumes that we who are listening to him now will not qualify for such mitigation. Using Luke's favorite image of table fellowship, Jesus depicts the master "girding" himself, just as the disciples have been told to do, and serving the servants who persevered in their service of watching and working. How often we brush off a thank-you from others by saying, "It was the least I could do!" And, sadly, how often we do the least we can! But true discipleship, in Luke's perspective, is not settling for the least we can get away with until our master's return, but getting ready by always being ready for his kingdom to come.

CAMBIOS NECESITO HACER

La "Parábola del rico insensato" del domingo pasado nos dio una razón de peso para hacer lo correcto, ahora: "Necio, esta noche se te pedirá la vida". Hoy, Jesús nos advierte: "También ustedes deben estar preparados, porque a la hora que no esperen, vendrá el Hijo del Hombre". Aunque no sabemos cuándo vendrá nuestro Maestro, si sabemos lo que él espera encontrar. Jesús espera que seamos vigilantes y diligentes en nuestro trabajo por el reino, pero también llenos de reverente misericordia hacia nuestros compañeros y hacia nosotros mismos. ¿Qué cambios necesito hacer, ahora mismo, para que las muchas personas que están fuera de "la casa del Maestro" quieran entrar para experimentar el consuelo sanador de la propia misericordia de Jesús en la compasión de los discípulos modernos de Jesús?

VIGILANCIA

Hoy Jesús propone una actitud universalmente contracultural: la vigilancia. Independientemente de nuestras otras diferencias, los modernos tememos la demora; ¡odiamos esperar! Las tres lecturas nos llaman a una vigilancia llena de fe, a una espera "concentrada", a una santa paciencia. En comunión con nuestros antepasados a lo largo de los siglos -a los que se dirigían Sabiduría y Hebreos-, nosotros, recordando la repentina desaparición del Rico Loco, debemos trabajar, dar testimonio y rendir culto en este mundo con el corazón puesto en el futuro que Dios ha preparado para nosotros, el cumplimiento de promesas audaces y hermosas: la liberación de las amenazas externas y de las cargas internas, una patria celestial, una ciudad aún por venir. Todos los que estamos llamados a la vigilancia espiritual deberíamos pensar también en los que trabajan, aunque otros duerman -policía, bomberos, socorristas-, haciendo nuestra la oración nocturna atribuida a san Agustín: "Vela, querido Señor, por los que se despiertan, velan o lloran esta noche, y encarga a tus ángeles y santos que cuiden de los que duermen. Atiende, Señor, a tus enfermos, da descanso a los cansados, bendice a los moribundos, alivia a los que sufren, compadece a los afligidos, protege a los alegres; y todo por tu amor. Amén".

DILIGENCIA

Nuestra vigilancia ha de ser no sólo orante, sino orientada al servicio, ese equilibrio activo-contemplativo que tan a menudo propone el Jesús de Lucas. Aunque la ignorancia de los deseos del maestro puede ganar un indulto para algunos, Jesús supone que nosotros, que le escuchamos ahora, no tendremos derecho a esa mitigación. Utilizando la imagen favorita de Lucas sobre la comunión en la mesa, Jesús representa al amo "ciñéndose", tal como se les ha dicho a los discípulos, y sirviendo a los siervos que perseveran en su servicio de vigilancia y trabajo. Cuántas veces desecharmos un agradecimiento de los demás diciendo: "¡Es lo menos que podía hacer!" Y, lamentablemente, ¡cuántas veces hacemos lo mínimo que podemos! Pero el verdadero discipulado, en la perspectiva de Lucas, no consiste en conformarse con lo mínimo que podamos hacer hasta el regreso de nuestro maestro, sino en prepararse estando siempre listos para que venga su reino.


